

St Pauls Cathedral was burnt down in the great fire. It was rebuilt under the order of King Charles and with the help of Sir Christopher Wren.	King Charles was the king at the time of the fire. He guided lots of people to rebuild the city after the fire burnt most of it down.	Thomas Farriner started the fire when he left his oven on at bed time. The fire spread from his bakery down Pudding Lane and throughout London.	Samuel Pepys saw the fire and wrote a diary recording what happened on each day. He buried his possessions underground so that they were safe.
