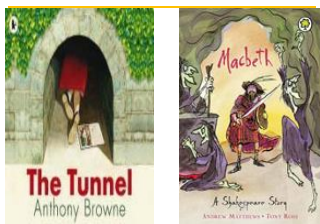

Geography: Antarctica

- To understand that the Northern and Southern Hemispheres have seasons at different times.
- To know what Antarctica is.
- To describe Antarctica's position in the far south and its polar climate.
- To identify who lives in Antarctica and explain why they are there.
- To describe how people adapt to living in Antarctica.
- To plot four-figure grid references.
- To contrast life in the UK and Antarctica (two lessons: climate, housing, daily life).

Maths:

SHAPE

- To learn what an angle is and connect it to quarter, half, and full turns.
- To find right angles in everyday objects and shapes.
- To spot if an angle is acute or obtuse
- To measure and draw straight lines accurately in millimetres using a ruler.
- To identify horizontal lines that go across and vertical lines that go straight up and down.
- To recognise parallel lines that never meet and perpendicular lines that meet at a right angle.
- To count the sides and vertices (corners) of 2D shapes.
- To draw flat 2D shapes like triangles, squares, and rectangles correctly.
- To describe 3D shapes by counting their faces, edges, and vertices.
- To build 3D shapes using construction materials or flat nets.
