Cart	Used to carry people and heavy loads. On wheels and pulled by horses.
Diary	A written record of events and experiences.
Escape	Get away, move away, get out.





**The Great Fire of London

Key Figures:

Samuel Pepys	A member of parliament famous for keeping a diary during the Great Fire of London.
Thomas Farriner	The owner of the bakery on Pudding Lane where the fire started.
Christopher Wren	Designed the current St Paul's Cathedral after it was burnt down during the fire.
King Charles the second	King of England at the time of the Great Fire of London.

Historical Terms:

Past ←	An event that has already happened. <i>Yesterday, Last week, Before, A long time ago</i>
Present ↓	Something that is happening now. <i>Now, happening now, today</i>
Future →	An event that is going to happen. <i>Next, Later, In an hour, tomorrow,</i>
Memory 	What we remember.
