Maths – Key Learning

Time:

- Reading Roman numerals from 1 to 12, especially on a clock face.
- Understanding how Roman numerals work, including subtracting (IV = 4) and adding (VI = 6).
- Recognising that Roman numerals don't repeat the same letter four times (e.g. 4 is IV, not IIII).

Position and direction:

- Reading Roman numerals from I to XII on a clock face.
- Understanding the rules for writing Roman numerals (e.g. IV, VI)
- Recognising patterns in adding and subtracting values in Roman numerals

English – Key Learning

Writing:

- A narrative based on Macbeth by William Shakespeare

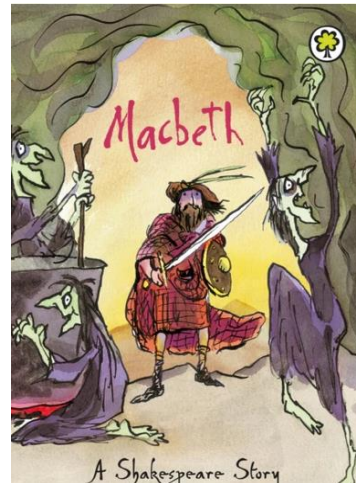
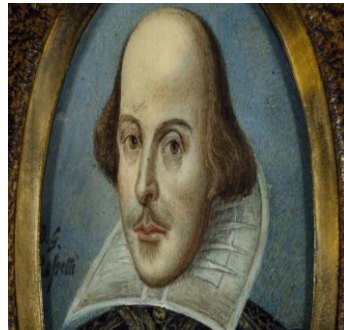

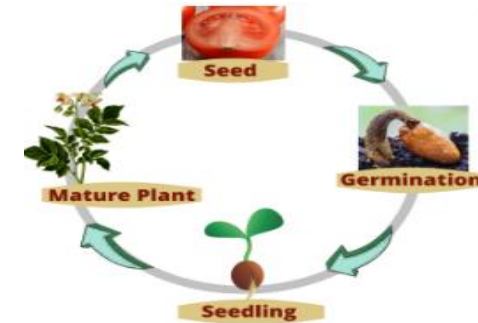
