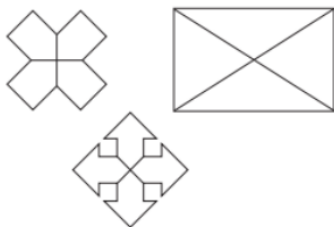

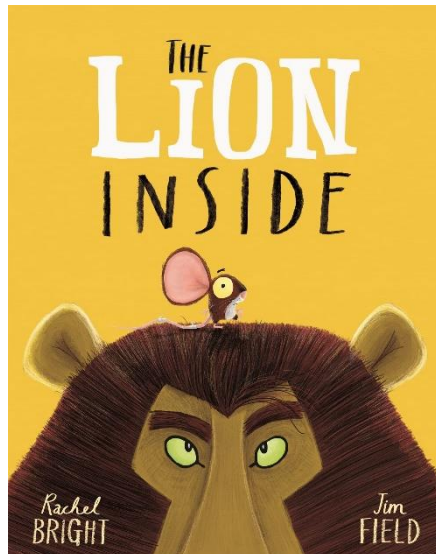

Rosa Parks was born in Tuskegee, Alabama, on February 4.	Rosa was told to give up her seat on a bus for a white person but she refused.	Rosa was charged with breaking the rules and causing trouble. She was found guilty and fined.	The bus boycott took place. Black people showed their support for Rosa by refusing to use the buses. The boycott lasted for 381 days.	Rosa Parks dies on October 24.
