Suffix -er

- Comparing things is a way to see how they are similar and different. We can use the -er suffix at the end of adjectives to show the comparative form of a word. This means we are comparing two things.

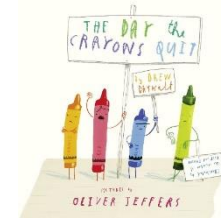
How the peach grew
