

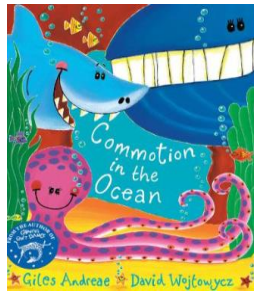
Reading – Key Texts

Geography :

The United Kingdom

- To understand that the United Kingdom (UK) is made up of 4 countries.
- To find and talk about England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland using a map.
- To identify landmarks and key features of each country.
- To understand weather patterns across the UK.

Maths:

Maths – Key Learning

Place Value, Length + Height, Mass + Volume

- To recognise tens and ones in numbers up to 50.
- To count forwards and backwards within 50.
- To compare numbers within 50.
- To compare the length and height.
- To use a ruler to measure in cm.
- To understand what mass and volume is.
- To compare the mass and volume of different objects.

Science: Animals Including Humans

- To compare the features of different animals.
- To sort animals based on their food groups.
- To describe and compare different kinds of fish.

Computing: Coding

- Understanding commands – Recognise that devices respond to instructions and that different commands produce different outcomes.
- Developing and testing commands – Explore how to match a command to its outcome and predict what will happen when a command is run.
- Planning and applying commands – Apply knowledge of commands to run them successfully on a device to achieve a specific result.

Value: Honesty

Honesty is about being truthful and making the right choices, even when it's hard, so that people know they can trust you.

Music:

- Exploring simple rhythms and adding new sounds or beats each week.
