Using, 'How to Train Your Dragon' book as inspiration, the children developed their writing skills through a range of exciting activities. They particularly enjoyed creating storyboards to sequence key events and deepen their understanding of narrative structure. The thrilling adventures and memorable characters sparked imaginative discussions and encouraged pupils to think carefully about how stories are organised and brought to life.



In Maths, pupils focused on statistics and coordinates, strengthening their skills in interpreting data, presenting information using charts and graphs, and accurately plotting points on a grid. They demonstrated great perseverance and confidence as they tackled these important concepts.

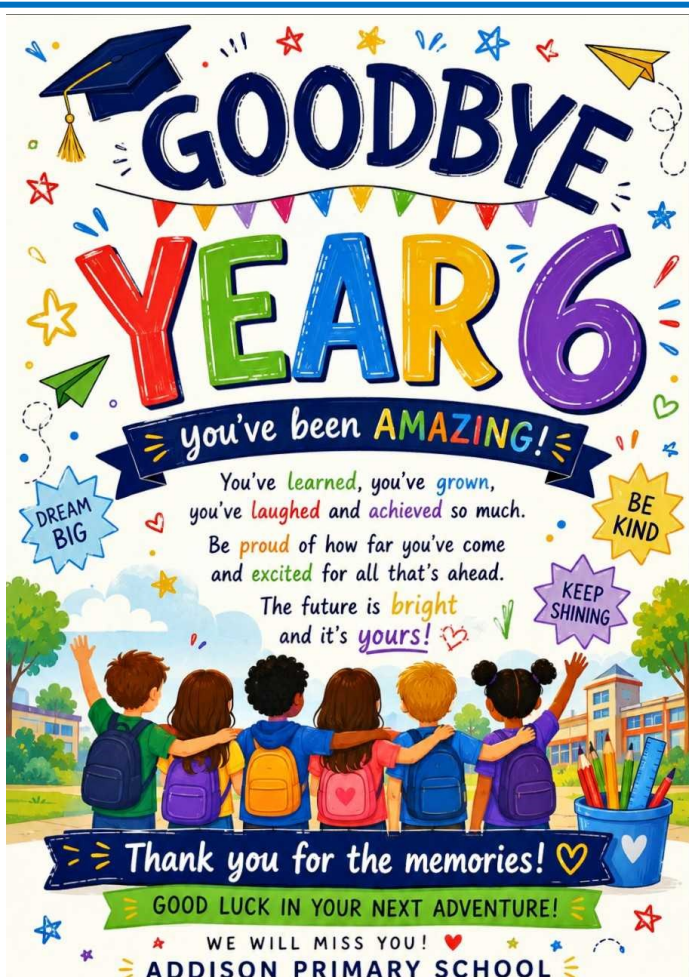
